- report a minor traffic accident
- give the police information about crime in your area
- speak to the police about a general enquiry



Clever 'voice activation' lets you speak directly to your local officer if you know their name or number

Want to know the Facts on Speeding where you live?

Lots of people in the Eastern area HAVE ASKED FOR 'black boxes' (covert traffic speed measuring devices) around their community. These have been analysed and the speed matrix findings from them is now on our community website www.your-community.org.uk/downloads.html for you to search and check the results.

At the last meeting

The Community Development Plan was launched! This has been named "Eastern Promises". The plan tells you what the priorities are for your area and what action is taking place to address the priorities.

Also at the meeting the public had an opportunity to talk to Local Councillors as well as public and voluntary sector organisations. They raised a number of issues such as parking in Riccall and the pot holes on George Terrace in Barlby these were passed to the relevant representatives and also taken through to the Partnership Board meeting for discussion to resolve the problems.
