- report a minor traffic accident
- give the police information about crime in your area
- speak to the police about a general enquiry

Clever 'voice activation' lets you speak directly to your local officer if you know their name and number.

Lots of people in the Tadcaster area HAVE ASKED FOR 'black boxes' (covert traffic speed measuring devices) around their Community. These have been analysed and the speed matrix findings from them is now on our community website
