Lorries to be watched - Your views about speeding traffic and HGV's have been taken forward into the "Beautiful South" Community Development Plan. The Partnership Board have been working hard with members from the Western forum to develop a Tool Kit for 'Lorry Watch schemes'.

Want to know the Facts on Speeding where you live?

Lots of people in the Southern area HAVE ASKED FOR 'black boxes' (covert traffic speed measuring devices) around their community. These have been analysed and the speed matrix findings from them is now on our community website www.your-community.org.uk/downloads.html for you to search and check the results.

At the last meeting

A presentation was given on the advantages and disadvantages of wind farms. A discussion took place after the presentation about how they work.

Members of the public had an opportunity to talk to Local Councillors as well as public and voluntary sector organisations. They raised a number of issues such as the ownership of Pollington airfield in Heck, the bad state of the A19 road, speeding in Drax, Carlton and Burn and parking issues in Carlton. These were passed to the relevant representative and also taken through to the Partnership Board for discussion and follow up action.

Burn village has organised a Christmas lights 'switch on' event for the last 5 years.

It has been attended by over 200 people and has raised funds exceeding £1,000 at each event; all the money goes to Charity.

They received funding of £900 in late 2011 from the Forum in order to upgrade and maintain the annual switch on of the Christmas Lights.

The switch on was held on the 26 November and is supported locally by the residents and businesses in the village. The event brought the

community together and enables them to raise money for worthy causes.
